## WHAT we've recently funded

#### **Grossing Station**

Cancer biopsies at the Royal Shrewsbury Hospital are now faster and easier for staff, thanks to a new £42,000 Grossing Station funded by the Lingen Davies Cancer Fund. This equipment doubles the capacity of the process, speeding up treatment for patients. Dr. Jeremy Johnson MBE, from the charity's Grants Committee, said they were delighted to support this vital addition to the pathology center.

The Grossing Station allows the hospital to process more samples quickly, aiding the team of 12 consultant pathologists in diagnosing and developing treatment plans. Debbie Wareing, Operational Manager, highlighted that it also helps train new staff while reducing specimen turnaround time.

#### **Thermometers**

Thanks to fundraising by the Lingen Davies Shrewsbury Fundraising Committee, chemotherapy patients now benefit from life-saving thermometers. Over three years, the group has raised an impressive £77,000.

#### **Support Therapies**

We now fund various therapeutic projects for cancer patients, including iCan cancer rehab, yoga, tai chi, horticultural therapy, and nature-based activities like "Renew and Restore" at Fordhall Farm. Full details are on our website.

- **Tai Chi,** Telford: 12-week program booking required.
- **Sound Baths**, Shrewsbury: Pilot sessions running at The Hamar Centre.

### **CANCER CHAMPIONS**

Thank you to our Cancer Champions and partners who were able to join us at The Trinity Centre this summer to celebrate the overwhelming success of the project.

More than 50 volunteers and health colleagues from the Shropshire, Telford & Wrekin Integrated Care Board (ICB), Powys Teaching Health Board, other voluntary organisations, and supporters attended.

Miranda Ashwell, LiveLife Project Lead, said: "We are thrilled to have the chance to mark the continued success of this work, the fantastic people who have volunteered to be trained as cancer champions and our colleagues in healthcare who recognise the importance of the project.

"Cancer Champions make such a difference in their communities across Shropshire, Alex said Telford & Wrekin, and Mid Wales and start Champior conversations with people in all walks of life. how her They are helping others to spot the signs of delivered cancer early and helping to save lives, the information impact they have should not be resulted underestimated.

"We now have more than 500 people trained and it looks like that number will, thankfully, keep growing," she added.

The work began in partnership with NHS Shropshire and Telford & Wrekin, and Qube in 2022. NHS funding came to end in April this year when we took on sole funding, but the project has been so successful the ICB has announced another £50,000 of funding to further the programme.

Alex Mace, Health Inequalities Manager at NHS Shropshire, Telford & Wrekin, shared some of the changes made because of feedback from Cancer Champions, including FIT Tests being delivered to GP practices instead of a fixed home address.

nropshire, Alex said: "The feedback of our Cancer and start Champions has already started to shape lks of life. how healthcare services are being e signs of delivered through developing the lives, the information healthcare staff use, which has not be resulted in better support for people to access life-saving health checks and screening.

"We look forward to continuing to work with Cancer Champions to tackle inequality and ensure everyone has an equal opportunity to receive health care."

The success of the project has also been recognised at a host of regional awards – being finalists in both the Shropshire Business Chamber Awards, and upcoming Powys Business Awards.

A well-known Shropshire artist has exclusively designed a Christmas card for us this year to raise awareness of cancer following her own diagnosis.

Lyn Evans, who creates unique hand torn paper collage art from her studio and shop No.61 on Mardol, Shrewsbury, has said she wants many more people to talk about cancer, the signs and the treatment - as well as take up their routine mammograms

The 52-year-old put off the routine mammogram she was invited to when she turned 50 as she was so busy, but a year later she had one and was diagnosed with stage two breast cancer.

Now she has created a pair of specialised pieces of art to raise money for Lingen Davies Cancer Fund – 'Tits' and The Celtic Cross.



"Everyone involved in my treatment was so lovely and friendly, very professional. I wanted to do something to say thank you so I created 'Tits' for Lingen Davies while awaiting treatment. I was also asked to do something for Christmas and so I created the Celtic Cross which represents Faith, Hope, Strength and Love."

A tribute to 26-year-old Young Farmer Will 'Choc' Roberts, who passed away from a brain tumour in December 2022, continues grow, with this year's Oswestry Illuminated **Tractor** Run set for Saturday, December 14, 2024.

The event, held in memory of the young farmer, will feature 100 lit-up tractors visiting surrounding villages. The procession will set off from Oswestry Livestock Market at 5pm, bringing together local farmers and the community in support of the Lingen Davies Cancer Fund.

Last year's tractor run, where 85 tractors lit up the night, raised more than £12,320, and this year's event is expected to be even bigger. Volunteers armed with donation buckets, kindly supplied by Agritel Online, will collect contributions as the tractors pass through villages. The event is also supported by Hughes Bros Agricultural & Groundcare Machinery and donate, visit our website. Aico, who are providing volunteers with hivis jackets and torches to ensure the event runs safely.

In total, more than £45,000 has been raised in Will's honour, including £8,000 from his funeral.

Fundraisers like the tractor run, along with charity auctions, rugby challenges, and events, continue to essential support to the Lingen Davies Cancer Fund, benefiting cancer patients in Shropshire and Mid Wales.

Dave and Sue Roberts, Will's parents, expressed their gratitude for overwhelming community support and said they are looking forward to this year's event becoming a lasting tradition. The illuminated tractor run is a powerful reminder of Will's legacy and the strength of the farming community in coming together for a worthy cause.

## TIM'S story

As we celebrate our 45th anniversary, our longestserving trustee, Tim Cooper, shared some memories from his long journey with Lingen Davies. Tim began his career in radiotherapy, eventually moving to Shropshire in 1989 to head up radiotherapy services at the Royal Shrewsbury Hospital. His involvement with Lingen Davies has spanned decades, including work with founder Frank Davies and major fundraising efforts, such as raising £1 million for a LINAC machine.



Over the years, Tim's role within the charity evolved, from general secretary to trustee of the newly formed Charitable Incorporated Organisation in 2017. Today, as Vice Chair, Tim brings invaluable experience, helping steer the charity through new challenges and opportunities, including expanding services like rehabilitation and community support. Tim semi-retired in 2021 but remains deeply involved, balancing roles in the NHS while pursuing his hobby of woodworking, with proceeds supporting Lingen Davies.

He was also named as the winner of our Eryl Williams Award at the recent celebration evening - in recognition of going above and beyond for Lingen Davies.
